We are very aware that the world that will meet the young women of tomorrow is one that will be shaped by a variety of new influences and unpredictable variables.

From the rise of artificial intelligence to the impact of ecological change on the planet, it is imperative we equip our girls with the skills to enjoy success and happiness by finding their place in the world.

In order to meet these challenges, the Junior School spirit is rooted in a commitment to exceptional teaching, a culture of innovation and, most importantly, a love of adventure.



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### Adventum: Our Academic Curriculum

Learning

Adventum, our curriculum, aims to fuse together the discovery of knowledge and skills. It is underpinned by provocative thinking, intellectual disruption, critical questioning and selfknowledge. It ensures pupils value the role they play in society and collaborate to positively shape the world around them.

Our bespoke, philosophy-led curriculum allows pupils to gain an understanding of meta physics, aesthetics and ethics within a rich context of storytelling, questioning and collaboration. Our learners are instilled with a love of wisdom, integrity of thought and the social awareness to act with compassion, confidence and agency. They are filled with a desire to grapple with and overcome the challenges by the world in which they are growing up.

The majority of our Adventum curriculum, especially in the Lower Junior School (Reception - Year 2) is delivered by our skilled class teachers who get to know the pupils they teach inside out and can support a fluid and smooth progression through the first stages of school. Our curriculum is, however, powerfully supported by specialist teaching across the Junior School and this increases as pupils move into the Upper Junior School. This allows us to harness the benefits of specialist expertise and subject knowledge and provide learning experiences that are ambitious and aspirational.

More information about the finer details of the delivery and coverage of the curriculum in each year group will be provided as part of our Welcome Evenings in early September and further supported thereafter via our virtual learning environment, Firefly. Miss Elizabeth Jenkins leads our curriculum and all aspects of teaching and learning in her capacity as Assistant Head Academic & Innovation.

Our Junior School Assessment Team work closely with all our teaching staff to track, monitor and analyse pupil performance on a termly basis. This team takes responsibility for ensuring that every pupil makes excellent progress across the curriculum and oversees our reports to parents. Parents are invited to attend two parents evenings in the Autumn and Spring terms and receive a written end of year report in the Summer Term.

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### Arcadia: Our Co-Curriculum

Childhood is all about trying new things and embarking on new adventures. Arcadia, our Junior School Co-Curricular programme, unites a wide range of co-curricular activities and opportunities for all Junior School pupils.

From day trips and workshops, to visiting speakers and inspiring lecture series, our extended school day offers a plethora of experiences for our girls. Each week our club programme provides stimulating and engaging forays into music, drama, engineering, science, debating, problem solving and golf, to name but a few, and this is complemented by our weekly enrichment afternoon which sees the whole Junior School timetable devoted to diverse co-curricular pursuits.

Club sign up takes place at the end of each term for the term ahead e.g. parents register for Spring term Clubs at the end of the Autumn Term. You will be contacted separately with information on the clubs available to your daughter when she starts at WHS.

There are no co-curricular clubs open to Reception pupils in the Autumn Term. This is to ensure that girls can settle into the stimulating school days, before embarking on any co-curricular adventures.



Our Wild Girls outdoor learning curriculum and Upper Junior School residential trips programme guarantee our girls time immersed in nature and the open air. From Reception, our girls love nothing more than donning their wellies and exploring Wimbledon Common.

Themed weeks devoted to maths, science and the arts are commonplace, as are a range of charity fundraising campaigns. Pupil voice is alive and kicking in the Junior School thanks to our vibrant School Council, Eco Warriors and range of Form Captain responsibilities.

# Junior School uniform expectations:

Our uniform and Sports kit supplier is School Blazer - www.schoolblazer.com

Full details of the uniform are listed on Firefly in the New Parents section.

In addition to this, our PTA, Friends of Wimbledon High School, run second-hand uniform sales: look out for notices throughout the year.

Girls take pride in their uniform and we hope that buying it and wearing it for the first time generates some excitement in your house over the summer! Pupils are of course expected to wear it smartly. We cannot stress enough the importance of naming all uniform, water bottles, shoes and trainers, etc!

- Long hair must be tied back with blue or green ribbon or plain hair bands.
- Shoes should be black leather, fastened with Velcro or a strap - not slip-on.
- Navy tights or navy knee length socks may be worn during winter.
- Summer socks should be white ankle length.
- Ideally, earrings should not be worn at all and if they are worn should be small studs, which have to be removed for games and swimming. If you are considering allowing your daughter to have pierced ears, then please do this at the start of the summer holidays. No other jewellery is to be worn except for religious reasons and must not be worn for PE or Swimming. Nail varnish must not be worn.

- The girls wear specific kit for PE. Trainers should be predominantly white and comfortable for your daughter to run around in!
- On the day your daughter has her sports lessons, she can wear her Sports kit to school. You will be provided with full timetable information at the Parent Welcome Event in September.
- Girls need to bring in their book bag on the first day of term, but not their PE bags.
- Please provide a water bottle for your daughter with her name on it - this can come to and from school in her book bag.
- Pencil cases are not required for Reception.





### Information You Need to Know

#### Morning drop off and afternoon pick up

We encourage sustainable travel to and from school and have created a **Parent School Agreement**, available in your induction pack, which we ask that all parents adhere to during their daughter's time at WHS.

We suggest that before September, you do a couple of trial runs of how you are going to get to school in the morning. Our central location in Wimbledon means that there are plenty of public transport options for families to consider, including bus, tube, mainline train and tram. Many families who live nearby also choose to walk, bike or scoot to

school - we have bike shelters for pupils to park their preferred mode of transport in!

Parents should ensure girls are at school by 8.20am. To secure the site, all gates will close at 8.45am. If you arrive later than this, please ring the bell on the gate and report to Junior School Office to sign your daughter in.

The playground is supervised from 8.15am every morning by a member of the Junior Leadership Team. This means parents can drop off their daughter at the Mansel Road gate safe in the knowledge that she will be closely supervised until registration commences at 8.30am.

#### Wraparound care is offered in the Junior School



For parents who require greater flexibility in drop-off and pick-up times around the school day, we offer Apple Pips wraparound care, providing a fun, relaxed environment for pupils.

Apple Pips is our in-house facility, run on-site by our own experienced Early Years practitioners. Activities include crafts, games, and role play. Provision to complete homework is available to pupils joining Apple Pips from the Upper Junior school. We aim to offer continuity for a regular booking for the academic year and operate a waiting list for additional requests during the year.

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# Information You Need to Know

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#### **Break and lunchtimes**

Pupils in Lower Junior School are provided with a fresh fruit snack each morning at break time. Pupils in Upper Junior School are invited to bring a healthy nut-free snack with them to enjoy at break time, for example a piece of fruit or a cereal bar.

School Lunch is compulsory for all Junior School pupils and the cost is added to and collected with the school fees. Allowance is made for school visits and there is no lunch on the last day of each term (when we finish at midday). Packed lunches are not permitted.

The school has a Healthy Eating Policy that recognises the need to cater for growing and energetic girls and is provided by our caterers, Chartwells. Our Catering Manager is always happy to discuss your daughter's dietary needs should you have concerns.

Pupils in Reception and Year 1 are served their meal providing a range of good quality, healthy food that is both interesting and appealing to pupils and staff alike. Pupils in Years 2-6 select their meal on a canteen basis from a weekly menu.

A member of staff supervises the younger girls very closely, encouraging them to try unfamiliar foods and to ensure that each pupil has a balanced meal. The menus are published on Firefly.

There are three Lunchtime Supervisors and other members of staff are on duty throughout lunchtime.

All pupils have time for free play at both morning break and lunch, supervised by Junior School staff. A range of playtime equipment is available; girls in Reception enjoy using the climbing frame and playing in the castle. We stagger the use of the playground to give everyone plenty of space.



# What should I expect if my daughter is unwell or incurs an injury whilst at school?

Our School Nursing Team is based in the Medical Room during school hours. All staff are regularly trained to administer basic First Aid. A number of staff throughout the school have undertaken more advanced training. They are on call should the nurse not be available. Lunchtime supervisors and teaching assistants carry First Aid kits to deal with minor injuries sustained in the playground. PE staff are trained to deal with injuries that may occur during lessons. The nurse will be called if they consider it necessary.

The nurses are not concerned solely with physical wellbeing, and are always happy to see pupils and listen to their concerns. The nurses are in the unique position of being neutral; they have many resources at their disposal and are always available to meet parents to discuss matters that affect your daughters.
